

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FOREWORD

On October 1st, 2024, the community of Transilvania University of Braşov – the largest and best-performing university in Romania's Central Region – included 21,711 students (undergraduate, master's and doctoral degree studies) from all the country's counties and from other 91 countries, but also 633 resident doctors, 76 students enrolled in the Romanian language preparatory year, and 1,320 academics, researchers and administrative staff. In the first part of 2024, elections for the university management team were held, as well as the selection of the deans and the appointment of vice-deans. As a result of this process, the university's top management team and 11 of the deans of the 18 faculties continue their activity for a new term. The new strategic plan of the university for the period 2024-2029 was approved by the University Senate, focused on three priority objectives: (1) increasing the university's performance, (2) developing a dynamic university community, adapted to the needs of society and (3) the university's full integration into the European higher education space and intensifying the internationalization process.

The priority of the UNITBV management was, on the one hand, the rigorous selection of human resources and, on the other hand, the stimulation of their performance through programmes and mechanisms financed both by the university and within national and international programmes, in the belief that people are the most important resource of our university. Also, projects of student teams were financed, which had as objectives the digitalization, modernization of teaching processes and the promotion of a green campus. At the same time, the programme of restoration and renovation of the teaching and social infrastructure of UNITBV continued, especially the buildings in the historical centre of Braşov and in the Colina campus, and a new didactic venue was purchased in the Danube Delta.

As in previous years, the study programmes have registered a high degree of stability, while the university's efforts to increase the offer of programmes in foreign languages and to develop new doctoral programmes continued. In addition, the number and quality of articles published in prestigious journals (indexed in the Web of Science) have also increased, as has the value of research/technical assistance contracts. UNITBV has continued its rise in terms of national and international visibility, ranking 5th in the national meta-ranking (only ahead of universities from Bucharest and Cluj-Napoca). The university has invested significantly in programmes to attract researchers and academics from abroad, and to support teaching staff and doctoral students to enrol in training internships abroad.


Active involvement in the cultural life continued in 2024, through the organization of numerous events by the Music Centre and the Multicultural Centre, such as performances, workshops and exhibitions abroad authored or organized by students and professors, in collaboration with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the diplomatic representations of Romania.

As part of the internationalization process, the number of partner institutions reached 718, from 90 countries worldwide, and the number of full-time students increased to 593, from 91 countries. The number of UNITBV scholarships increased significantly (including the "Transilvania Academica Scholarship" scholarship programme for non-EU students), and in 2024, priority was given to international students in the master's and doctoral degrees.

The annual revenues of the university were 428.9 million lei, and the expenses were 405.2 million lei, the university recording at the end of 2024 a cumulative budget surplus of over 228.1 million lei. All these achievements reflect the dedicated effort of the UNITBV community towards the university's sustainable development and its recognition as a prestigious higher education institution at a national and international level.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITY

Transilvania University of Braşov is the largest university in Romania's Centre Region. It is a mature university that has gained highly significant prestige over time at national and international level. Its stability and strength derive both from the wide diversity and from the unity of its integral elements. A comprehensive university, UNITBV offers Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes in over 40 fields (engineering, mathematics and computer science, biomedical sciences, social sciences, arts and humanities, as well as sports and physical education). The educational offer correlates with the professional requirements of the labour market, especially in terms of Master's and continuing education programmes. The university structure includes programmes designed in collaboration with the companies that are traditional employers of UNITBV graduates, but also niche programmes that anticipate the society's need for professional training in new areas of knowledge. This is why some programmes do not run every academic year as they are replaced by others which are of interest for the candidates. The sections dedicated to Bachelor's degree study programmes and Master's degree study programmes offer information about the Bachelor's and Master's programmes enrolling students in the academic year 2024-2025.

The teaching infrastructure is subject to continuous improvement as the university provides students with access to ergonomic spaces, state-of-the-art equipment and updated scientific information, as well as to an e-learning platform.

All the study programmes are accredited or authorized by the Romanian Agency for Quality Assurance in Higher Education, that evaluated the university in 2007, in 2013, in 2018 and in 2023 and granted the grade 'high degree of reliability'.







Number of enrolled students and graduates at bachelor's degree, by fields



Number of enrolled students and graduates at masters's degree, by fields





The position of Assistant Lecturer are occupied mainly for a fixed period of time by doctoral students and fresh PhD graduates aspiring for a university career.






The recognition of the qualities of the academic teaching personnel through a consistent financial regard (increase of the monthly salary by RON 1500 for one year) is a means of which UNITBV annually stimulates the performance of its academic staff in terms of their activity with students.

UNITBV is the only Romanian university to have implemented the programme "The most appreciated professor by the class" since the academic year 2017-2018. The mechanism by which this programme is applied involves each graduate's secret "vote" (cast before their final exam) for the most appreciated professors.

The salary increase is granted to: (a) the members of the academic staff who received the highest number of "votes" from Bachelor's degree graduates, and (b) the members of the academic staff who totalled the highest percentage of "votes" from the Bachelor's and Master's degree graduates (15% of the total number of tenured academic personnel in each case).

In 2024, based on the votes of the year's graduates, 218 academic staff members (53 professors, 77 associate professors, 72 lecturers and 16 assistant lecturers) received the salary increase based on their performance as evaluated by the graduates.



RESEARCH

Interdisciplinary research reflects the university's comprehensive structure, integrating engineering, social sciences, humanities, arts, medicine, mathematics, sports and physical education. It also serves as a strategic cornerstone for the institution's regional and international recognition. In 2024, the outcomes of the 722 teaching staff and 53 researchers reflect a consistent trend towards enhanced performance. This is evidenced by the increased publication rate in esteemed journals and the elevated quality of results, including heightened visibility and the broadening scope of research projects, establishment of international partnerships, and diversification of dissemination methods. Furthermore, the university's notable standings in both international and national rankings underscore the success of its research endeavours.



UNITA – Universitas Montium – Research Grants



Transilvania University of Braşov is part of the UNITA Universitas Montium university alliance, one of the 65 university alliances funded by the European Commission to test new models of governance, education, and research aimed at developing the concept of a European University. In 2024, eight Starting Grant-type projects were funded in the fields of cultural heritage and green energy, the first ones in a series of such grants.

The budget for UNITBV amounted to EUR 37,000. Within the UNITA alliance, research activity is integrated in six hubs or research networks: cultural heritage, green energy, digital transition, health, circular economy and environment, and inclusive societies.



STUDENTS AND THE RELATION WITH
THE ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT

Throughout the year 2024, Transilvania University (UNITBV) continued to allocate resources for the development and modernization processes of the university campus, aiming to ensure optimal study and living conditions for students. As such, repair and rehabilitation and modernization works were carried out on a series of teaching and common spaces. Similar works were also performed in the university dormitories, both inside and in adjacent exterior areas (alleys, parks, household waste collection areas, etc.).

The academic performance of students was supported through the provision of specific scholarships (for academic performance), while international mobility (for study and practice) was supported through mobility scholarships; students with social issues benefited from social scholarships and other support options (free accommodation and/or meals, tuition fee reductions/exemptions, etc.).

A series of events and projects for students, which have become traditional at UNITBV, were organized and carried out, such as the Gala of Valedictorians, Graduates in Front of Companies – AFCCO, the Student Scientific Circles Session, the Colina League Cup, the Transilvania Summer Event – TSE, and the Green – Life Hackathon.

A special emphasis was placed on programmes that motivate high-achieving young people; thus, high school graduates who chose to study at UNITBV as valedictorians of their high school and bachelor's degree graduates who were valedictorians at their faculties and chose to continue their studies in UNITBV's master's programmes were granted free laptops, accommodation, and meals. Moreover, the valedictorians of the faculties took part in an exchange trip that included visits to the University of Washington in Seattle and to the companies Microsoft and Boeing.





INTERNATIONALIZATION

The year 2024 marked the transition of Transilvania University of Braşov into a new stage of development, reflected in the strategic plan developed for the period 2024-2029. The intensification of the internationalization process continues to be a priority for achieving one of the three strategic objectives during this period. In line with the university's strategy, the internationalization strategy has been developed, with the following specific objectives: (i) Regular consultations with the International Advisory Council of Transilvania University of Braşov, composed of the rectors of the universities in the UNITA European University Alliance, regarding the university's development directions and increasing its international visibility; (ii) Supporting foreign language programmes in each faculty and organizing double/multiple degree programmes in partnership with other universities abroad (especially within the UNITA Alliance), especially at the master's and doctoral degrees; (iii) Financial support for the annual participation of each tenured faculty member and researcher in at least one scientific or professional training/specialization event abroad and funding for the university's own internship programmes for training/documentation/data collection/scientific and teaching activities abroad; (iv) Strengthening institutional and financial mechanisms to encourage the participation of faculty members and students (especially doctoral students) in technical assistance and international cooperation projects funded by national and international agencies/organizations; (v) Continuing the programme for developing the linguistic skills of the academic staff, administrative personnel, and doctoral students, as well as the financial incentive programme for faculty members who teach in foreign languages; (vi) Continuing funding for the university's programmes to attract valuable international experts for collaboration in teaching and research (including external doctoral supervisors), as well as in administrative activities, and continuing the scholarship/support programmes for international students (especially those from developing countries); (vii) Continuing collaboration with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Romania's diplomatic missions abroad, and other institutions/organizations in the country and abroad to develop joint educational or research/technical assistance projects to promote the Romanian language, culture, and civilization, as well as to attract international students; (viii) Increasing the number of international students and intensifying actions and events organized for them to facilitate their adaptation and integration into the university community and the society; (ix) Funding the participation of university staff in international educational fairs (under the "Study in Romania" banner, together with other Romanian universities), university promotion events abroad, and recruitment of international students.

The upward trend in the university's exposure to the international academic environment continued both through participation in international events and the exchange of best practices, as well as through the development of infrastructure for internationalization activities "at home". Last but not least, UNITBV has been an active presence in the UNITA University Alliance, contributing to its strengthening through the numerous activities carried out.





Revenues

The total revenues collected in 2024, originating from subsidies to public institutions and own revenue, amount to RON **428,980,833**, marking an increase of **28.77%** compared to those recorded in 2023, and an increase of **38.35%** compared to those recorded in 2022.

Revenues in RON collected in 2024 by sources of origin



In 2024, the university's degree of self-financing, derived from tuition fees, administrative fees, donations and sponsorships, rents, scientific research, student residence-halls and canteens, and from non-refundable financing amounted to **21.63%**. The remaining **78.37%** was covered by funding from the Ministry of Education and Research as basic financing, and through allocations from the state budget with a special purpose.

Expenditure

In the reported period, Transilvania University of Braşov made total payments of RON 405,264,313, by RON 23,716,520 less than the revenues actually collected in the fiscal year under analysis.


The growth rate of the total expenditure in 2024 was lower than that of the total revenue collected, thereby positively impacting the budgetary outcome by increasing it.

Expenditure on salaries, materials and services, capital expenditures as well as social support for students – namely transports costs and other expenditures on study travels and materials for students, constituted a smaller proportion of the total expenditure as opposed to the previous year, whereas spending on scholarships increased pursuant to changes in scholarship amounts outlined in Higher Education Law No. 199/2023 and other regulations. Also, expenditures from external funds and the PNRR (National Recovery and Resilience Plan) recorded an increase in 2024 due to the implementation of the digitalization grant.

Results of the budget execution

In accordance with Article 59 (1) of the Public Finance Law No. 500/2002, the budget outcome is determined by the variance between revenues and expenditures.

In this context, as of December 31, 2024, Transilvania University of Braşov registered a budget surplus, reflected in the liquid assets available in accounts held with the Braşov Treasury and commercial banks, as follows:

■ available in Braşov Treasury = RON 192,178,745, of which:

- surplus related to budget execution = RON 191,015,493
- Norwegian EAA mechanism surplus = RON 11,293
- available in special accounts= RON 1,151,959

■ available in commercial banks = RON 35,986,756, of which:


- in the foreign currency account = RON 11,377,920
- from international projects = RON 24,526,889
- in special accounts = RON 81,947

The liquid assets held in special accounts comprises performance bonds, tender guarantees, management guarantees, letters of bank guarantee, salary deposits, scholarship deposits, and sponsorships from previous years.

The recorded surplus is relatively constant and is generated 84.23% by the core activity carried out through the State Treasury accounts, and 15.77% by the activity conducted through commercial banks.

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
