Course description (Syllabus): The elective course aims to discuss Romanian Canonical literary works, but also the less known literary creations, from a different perspective than the one exclusively focussing on their aesthetic and stylistic value. Among others, it will highlight, in different and relevant configurations, the power relations established between the characters, but also established as a result of the implicit social pressure in identity constitutive discourses, the change of individual identity in the urban and rural mentalities conflict, the management of female identity during the interwar modernization in relation to the new possibilities (and obstacles). The approach will be multifocal, sociological and cultural, as well as phenomenological, exploring the various ways of action and reaction of the individuals in relation to the prevailing narrations of the interwar and post-war society. The perspective will be flexible, without a predefined scheme, but we will rather concentrate upon the interpretative wealth offered by the discussed novels and upon using the theoretical patterns only as instruments to stimulate personal reflection.
