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UNITBV IN WEBOMETRICS RANKINGS

Transilvania University of Brașov is among the top universities in Romania, according to the latest report published by *Ranking Web of Universities* (Webometrics) on 27 January 2021 (http://webometrics.info/en/Europe/Romania).



The ranking measures the results of over 31,000 universities worldwide, of which 102 are Romanian higher education institutions. According to the Webometrics report, UNITBV ranks fifth in Romania, 567th in Europe and 1422nd in the world (at the time of publication of this ranking).

The ranking released in early 2021 came up with new rules compared to the indicators taken into account in previous editions. Thus, the indicator "presence" was excluded, which had a weight of 5% and represented the "online presence", directly proportional to the size (number of pages) of the main web domain of the institution. The current indicators taken into account by Webometrics are:

- visibility number of external networks (subnets) linking to the institution's webpages (50%);
- transparency number of citations registered by the authors of the institution on Google Scholar platform (10%);
- excellence in research number of papers amongst the top 10% most cited in each of all 26 disciplines of the full database in the reference period 2015-2019 (40%).

Webometrics ranking is published twice a year (the data are collected in the first weeks of January and July to be made public at the end of these months)

and measures the results of 31,000 higher education institutions worldwide in over 200 countries.

Set up in 2004 by Cybermetrics Lab (Spanish National Research Council, CSIC) in Spain, Webometrics is a ranking system for universities around the world, which is based on indicators that take into account both the volume of web content and the visibility and impact of scientific papers.

The main objective of this web ranking is to promote the knowledge generated by universities in the Open Access system. According to the principles of this ranking, the best strategy to improve the site is to increase the quantity and quality of web content.

Given that other rankings focused only on a few issues considered relevant, in particular on the research results, the ranking based on web indicators better reflects the whole institutional picture, as many other activities of the professors and researchers are evidenced by their presence on the internet.

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UNITBV SPECIALISTS GET INVOLVED IN DEVELOPING THE NATIONAL FOREST STRATEGY

The Central Public Authority in charge of forests invited all stakeholders in the forestry sector to participate in a structured dialogue, with a view to substantiating strategic options for the development of forest policy. The design and moderation of the consultation process were based on a collaboration protocol between the Ministry of Environment, Waters and Forests, the Faculty of Silviculture and Forest Engineering within Transilvania University of Brașov and the Faculty of Silviculture within Ștefan cel Mare University of Suceava.



Held from July 2020 to February 2021, the consultation process took place mostly online and aimed at involving all stakeholders in forest management in a structured dialogue in order to formulate concrete and substantiated positions on the development directions of forest policy.

The consultation process also aimed to ensure an objective, transparent and supportive dialogue framework. In this way, it was possible to involve in the consultation process 226 participants, represented by both organizations and independent

experts, who covered all areas of activity relevant to the forestry sector. The entire process, including the results obtained, can be watched on the dedicated website

The final report paves the way to the development of the long-awaited national strategy for the forestry sector, clarifying the position of stakeholders on both consensus issues and sensitive or controversial issues. At the same time, it directs the efforts of the central authority towards finding effective, efficient solutions with a high level of acceptance.

The report contains valuable information on the ability of stakeholders to contribute constructively and professionally to the future of the forestry sector. But above all, the results of the consultation process show that a transparent and rigorously structured dialogue makes possible the positive and civilized exchange of views, even in the online environment, commonly used to radicalize the opinions expressed.

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THE ONLY XYLOTHEQUE IN ROMANIA

The Faculty of Silviculture and Forest Engineering owns the largest collection of wood samples (xylotheque) in Romania.

This collection contains about 3,000 wood samples of over 500 species, mostly wood of species from other continents (Africa, South America, Asia) among which we mention: eucalyptus, mahogany, ebony, makkasar ebony, okan, zebrano, khaja, etc.

This collection belongs to the endowment of the Forest Products Laboratory and is useful in training future forestry engineers, serving as study material for wood characteristics, physical and mechanical properties or durability and conservation.



The wooden samples have standard dimensions (0.5x3x6 inches) in line with the instructions of the

International Wood Collectors Society - IWCS. The faculty collection also contains some very old samples from Romania, the oldest being 138 years old (cherry species, 1882, Bolintinu-Cotroceni location).



The xylotheque is currently being restored, the students of the Faculty of Silviculture and Forest Engineering being also involved.

"INTERNATIONAL STUDENT RESEARCH WEBINAR IN LANGUAGE AND CULTURE" IN ITS SECOND EDITION

On 19 January 2021 the second edition of *International Student Research Webinar in Language and Culture* took place, a meeting for graduate and undergraduate students, organized in partnership by the Department of English within Penza State University, Russia, and by the Department of Theoretical and Applied Linguistics of the Faculty of Letters within Transilvania University in Braşov.



It is worth mentioning that this event is the result of several years of collaboration between the two universities, between which there is a cooperation agreement, but also a close relationship within the Erasmus+ programme, which enabled several mobility exchanges for students and professors.

The event brought together students from the two universities who addressed in their presentations various topics in the field of linguistics, such as methods of building the identity of authors of political blogs; hybridity of the Romanian political television interview; representations of collectivism in the professors' online communities; intercultural communication from the perspective of foreign students attending courses at Transilvania University of Brașov; Germany's language policy reflected in the country's legislation; analysis of the anti-immigration discourse in Hungary.

Although these concerns might seem very different, the questions and discussions that followed each presentation highlighted many common areas of interest, including the issue of building identity through language or the manipulation through the media.



We thank our colleagues at Penza State University, especially Professor Tatiana Dubrovskaya, for providing the infrastructure necessary to carry out this event. We hope that the meeting provided an opportunity for the participating students to establish connections with colleagues who have similar research concerns.

And yet it seems that the world is starting to move.



MOMENTS IN THE HISTORY OF AUTOMOTIVE HIGHER EDUCATION AT BRAȘOV Invitation to reading


The celebration in 2019 of 70 years of existence of the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering and implicitly of 70 years of automotive higher education in Brașov revived the interest in highlighting the essential moments of their evolution, an interest also manifested due to the appearance of "Monograph of the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering 1949-2019".



The pages of the book "Moments in the history of automotive higher education at Brașov" resulted from the effort to offer students at the Department of Automotive and Transport Engineering (DATR), the graduates of the study programmes "Cars and Tractors" and "Road Vehicles", the young teaching staff in the department, as well as all those interested, the essential and determining aspects of the creation, evolution and development of Brașov automotive education in its 71 years existence, in the awareness that the present and the future are built naturally on the knowledge of the past.

These pages of the history of Brașov automotive higher education are based on documents related to the various phases of its evolution, but also on the oral history transmitted from generation to generation by the masters who served the automotive school.

Furthermore, the emergence and evolution of automotive higher education in Brașov are organically related to the creation and development of the Faculty of Mechanics within the current Transilvania University of Brașov. For these reasons, a special space was given to the history of the establishment and development of the Faculty of Mechanics.

It is also worth mentioning here the chapter "Images from the archives of AT (AM) Department", in which the reader will discover the Central Library of the A/C building during 1950-1965 or the Laboratory of Engines with Ono-Sokki Japanese stand, destined to the ICPAT automotive students in the years 1974-1990, and last but not least the references in the chapter "Professors having formed the graduates of the Department Cars and Tractors/ Road Vehicles".

Alone Together is a series of six solo piano concerts conceived during the COVID-19 pandemic.



Organized by the Multicultural Centre of Transilvania University of Brașov, and curated by the pianist Lucian Ban, the series borrows the name of a classical jazz standard and presents, between January and June 2021, six of the most representative Romanian jazz pianists improvising solo - perhaps the absolute expression of chamber music - and answering questions from Lucian Ban and Adrian Lăcătuș, Director of the Multicultural Centre.



Through this fifth season of Chamber Jazz@ Transilvania University, taking place in unusual conditions, we aim to bring the musicians close to community again. The series consists of six solo piano recitals starring Mircea Tiberian, Alexandru Olteanu, Toma Dimitriu, Lucian Ban, Sebastian Spanache and Romeo Cozma, and it is filmed and recorded live on the University's extraordinary Dseries Steinway, and broadcast on the Facebook and YouTube pages of the Multicultural Centre.

"As we know, the health crisis has marked the world, across countries and continents, and affected our communities in an unprecedented way. Perhaps the performers were among the most affected, seeing their lives completely suspended. Although the distancing measures still keep us away from each other, we hope that this project will show, once again, that music and arts can bring hope and relief. 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IN MEMORIAM - PROF. DOC. DR. ENG. GHEORGHE NIŢESCU (1924 – 1986)

He graduated from the Polytechnic Institute of Iaşi in 1950, obtaining in 1953 the scientific title of Doctor of Engineering in the Tractors specialization at the Polytechnic Institute in Kharkov. After obtaining the title of Doctor, he became Associate Professor and Director of the Institute of Mechanics in Braşov.

In 1956 he initiated and achieved the unification of the higher education institutes in Brasov into one. He led the new Institute until 1961, when he was appointed ambassador to Prague.

Between 1966 and 1971 he was Professor and Rector of the Polytechnic Institute of Braşov, initiating investments for the buildings in Colina Campus, under the name of the Faculty of Mechanics. At the same time, he was a partisan of the unification of the Polytechnic Institute with the Pedagogical Institute. By their unification, the University of Braşov eventually came into being in 1971. Based on his achievements, he obtained the scientific title of Docent Doctor in 1972.

IN MEMORIAM - PROF. DR. ENG. IVAN ERLICZ (1912 – 1997)

He graduated from the Technical University of Stuttgart in 1938. After graduation, he worked at Ganz company in Budapest as a mechanical engineer and transmission designer. In 1941, he was hired at the Enterprise of Cars and Automobiles S.A., in Arad, the Romanian representative of the Ford company.

From 1949 to 1965, he was the representative of the Ministry of Agriculture at the Tractor Plant in Brasov. Starting with 1965, he transferred with the basic position to the Polytechnic Institute of Brasov.

Between 1952 and 1977 (year of his retirement) he conducted his activity as a Professor within the Chair of Cars and Tractors of the Polytechnic Institute of Braşov. He taught the disciplines "Manufacture and repair of motor vehicles and tractors", respectively "Operation and technical maintenance of motor vehicles". In 1971 he obtained the title of Doctor of Engineering in Vehicles and Tractors.

Over the years, he led numerous scientific research works and coordinated withal a series of groups in charge of writing university textbooks, being the first author of the courses of "Technology of manufacture and repair of motor vehicles" in the country.
