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OPENING OF THE 2025-2026 ACADEMIC YEAR AT TRANSILVANIA UNIVERSITY OF BRAȘOV

Brașov academic community inaugurated the 2025-2026 academic year on 1 October, in a festive setting attended by guests of honour, representatives of the local and county administration, socio-economic and cultural partners, academic teaching personnel, students, together with their families and close acquaintances.



They were all welcomed in “Sergiu T. Chiriacescu” Conference Centre of Transilvania University on the *Gaudeamus Igitur* anthem tunes, which heralded the beginning of a new educational cycle within the greatest and best-performing institution in the Centre region. “The new academic year is a beginning full of hope and responsibility, a moment of thrill for the students, as well as the academic teaching personnel’s promise to keep forming generations of professionals apt to change not only their own future, but also of everyone around them”, Prof. Dr. MD Liliana Rogozea, Vice-Rector for Public Relations, emphasised.

5,370 students started their academic training at UNITBV, with 4,193 of them in the full-time form of education. They were joined by 2,039 graduate students and 140 doctoral students of Romanian origin, in the junior year as well, all of them eager to strengthen the knowledge in their fields of interest. Internationalization and diversity are core attributes for the academic community of Brașov, as highlighted by the 158 international students coming from 41 countries, who opted for the bachelor’s, master’s and doctoral programmes or, for the time being, the Romanian language preparatory year. Other 93 students under the “Romanians everywhere” category, from four countries, also integrated into the UNITBV community.

A moment of special appreciation was dedicated to BlueStreamline car-racing team, consisting of 33 students and their coordinator, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Mihai Comșit. They were invited on stage alongside the Rector

of our University, Prof. Dr. Eng. Ioan Vasile Abrudan, to be congratulated and honoured for their outstanding performances in the international competitions. BlueStreamline team took the podium in all competitions attended under the combustion class, and achieved notable results with their first electric single-seater.

In his address, the Rector of Transilvania University of Brașov, Prof. Dr. Eng. Ioan Vasile Abrudan, emphasised: “I would like to thank our partners, represented here, institutions and companies in the region of Brașov, and assure them that we will keep developing projects together for the benefit of both parties. Moreover, we will get actively involved in the initiatives of Brașov County Council and City Hall, which our University contributes with its expertise and professional capabilities.”



During the event, the floor was taken by Mihai-Cătălin Văsi, Prefect of Brașov County, Adrian Vește, President of Brașov County Council, and George Scripcaru, Mayor of Brașov Municipality. They praised UNITBV’s role in stimulating knowledge and scientific progress, and emphasised the importance of the best relations of the local and regional entities with the university.

The ceremony continued with a musical interlude performed by the artists Zsombor Filip and Izabella Máthé, representatives of the Faculty of Music. The event ended in yet another festive touch, the tunes of the Choir of the Faculty of Music, under maestro Ciprian Cucu’s baton.

A new institutional agreement was signed with Sapporo Gakuin University, Kindai University, Ryokoku University, Kwansei Gakuin University, Meisei University, Nihon University, Otaru University of Commerce, as well as with University of Tokyo – School of Engineering in the month of October.

The Romanian Pavilion within Expo 2025, in Osaka, hosted the signing ceremony for a cooperation agreement between our University and the University of Hyogo (Japan).

The event took place on 4 October, within a ceremony where the agreement was signed by Prof. Dr. Makoto Kosaka, Rector of the University of Hyogo, and Prof. Dr. MD Liliana Rogozea, Vice-Rector of Transilvania University of Braşov. The ceremony took place under Ferdinand Nagy's patronage, as Commissioner General for Romania's Pavilion.

Prof. Dr. Mădălina Rucsanda, Dean of the Faculty of Music, Prof. Dr. Stela Drăgulin, Director of the Music Centre, and the other UNITBV delegation members had by their side Carmen Tămaş, Professor of Japanese culture at the University of Hyogo, who emphasised the importance of the agreement signed by the two institutions.

The event is another instance of enhanced collaboration with prestigious universities around the world, in the field of education, research and innovation, as part of UNITBV's internationalization strategy.

The ceremony was opened by Ferdinand Nagy, the Commissioner General, who highlighted UNITBV's role in promoting authentic values, in creating the framework for the promotion of Romania and Romanian schools, as well as in developing educational, cultural and scientific partnerships.



The ceremony attendees had the opportunity to watch video presentations of the two universities.

The festive moment ended with the signing of the collaboration agreement and an artistic moment offered by Botond Szöcs, Lector Dr. at Transilvania University of Braşov, who gave a piano recital highly appreciated by the audience.

Two international student scientific events took place between 9 and 11 October 2025. The former is ELSTUDIS 2025 International Scientific Symposium, now in its 4th edition, organised by “Gheorghe Asachi” Technical University of Iași, Faculty of Electrical & Power Engineering and Computer Science, and by the Electrical-Engineering Student League; and the latter is “Brainstorming in the Agora of Student Circles” (BACSTUD 2025) International Symposium, in its 11th edition, organised by Agora University of Oradea, in Băile Felix.

Transilvania University of Braşov was represented in Iași by Camelia Moșuț and Florian Emanuel Alecu, 4th-year students in the Electrical Engineering and Computers bachelor’s study programme (taught in English), as well as by Bogdan Ioan Oprea, a 1st-year student in the Advanced Electrical Systems master’s study programme (taught in English), accompanied by Lect. Energy Applications; Artificial Intelligence in the Electrical and Energy Field; Metrology and Measuring Systems; Advanced Materials in the Electrical Field; Software Applications in Electrical Engineering; Management Systems and Environmental Policies; Modern Techniques in the Electric Power System.

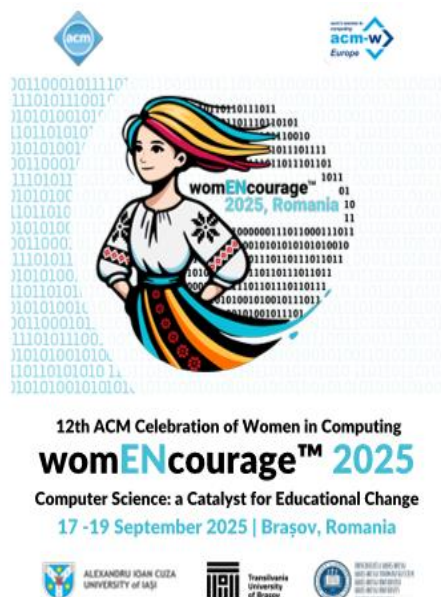

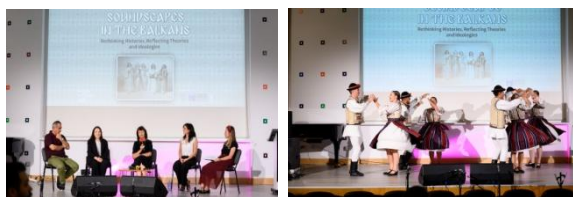

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AN INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE IN THE CITY OF BRAȘOV: *SOUNDSCAPES IN THE BALKANS – RETHINKING HISTORIES, REFLECTING THEORIES AND IDEOLOGIES*

Between 3 and 5 September 2025, the Faculty of Music within Transilvania University of Brașov hosted *Soundscapes in the Balkans – Rethinking Histories, Reflecting Theories and Ideologies*, the 9th edition of the International Musicology Conference, in partnership with the National University of Music, Bucharest, the Union of Romanian Composers and Musicologists, IMS Regional Association for the Study of Music of the Balkans (RASMB) and The International Musicological Society.

The event took place in “Sergiu T. Chiriacescu” Conference Centre of Transilvania University, and the organising committee included Prof. Dr. Mădălina Rucsanda, Dean of the Faculty of Music, UNITBV, Prof. Dr. Nicolae Gheorghită, National University of Music, Bucharest, alongside professors at the Faculty of Music, UNITBV: Assoc. Prof. Dr. Alexandra Belibou, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Noemy Karacsony, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Alina Nauncef, Assist. Prof. Dr. Iuliana Isac, and Adj. Prof. Dr. Ion Negrilă.



The conference brought together musicologists and researchers from our country and abroad (Australia, Greece, England, Macedonia, Austria, Bulgaria, Serbia, Türkiye, Cuba) and took place over three intense days, which were structured into several sessions, under which various topics were addressed and debated – *Rethinking Histories, Culture and Soundscapes in the Balkans, Byzantine and Post-Byzantine Chant, Ethnomusicology and Music and Politics*.

The participants had the privilege of listening to speeches and lectures delivered by prominent guests as *keynote speakers*. We enjoyed the presence of Kate van Orden, professor at Harvard University, USA, chairperson of ISM, John Griffiths, professor at the University of Melbourne, Australia, deputy chairperson of ISM, and Valentina Sandu-Dediu, professor at the National University of Music, Bucharest, and Rector of *New Europe College* Institute for Advanced Studies.

The conference agenda included relevant moments such as *round tables* moderated by Prof. Dr. Valentina

Sandu-Dediu (topic: *The Decisive Impact of Archival Studies on Revisiting the Histories of Romanian Music*) and Prof. Dr. Maria Alexandru, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece (topic: *Interrelations between Word and Music in Various Traditions of the Christian East and Orient*), recital reading, *Greek Art Song: A Glimpse in Time and Style* – a moment offered by Ioanna Vrakatseli (mezzo-soprano) and Sofia Kontossi (piano).

Apart from the highly interesting discussions, the participants had the opportunity to enjoy a rich artistic programme featuring Romanian folk dances performed by *Lads of Brașov* Student Folklore Ensemble, as well as exceptional musical performances offered by professors and students of the Faculty of Music, UNITBV: Gustav Királyhalmi (piano), Adj. Prof. Drd. Amalia Nicolau (pan flute) and Trio Transilvania, *Anatoly* Quintet, as well as *Codex Ensemble*, consisting of Prof. Dr. Ignác Csaba Filip (flute, artistic director), Assoc. Prof. Dr. Noémi Karácsony (mezzo-soprano), Assoc. Prof. Dr. Alina Nauncef (violin), Drd. Zsombor Filip (lute), and the students Daniel Mozes (cello), Ariana Modiga (drums), Alexandru Nauncef (violin) and Vlad Nauncef (viola).

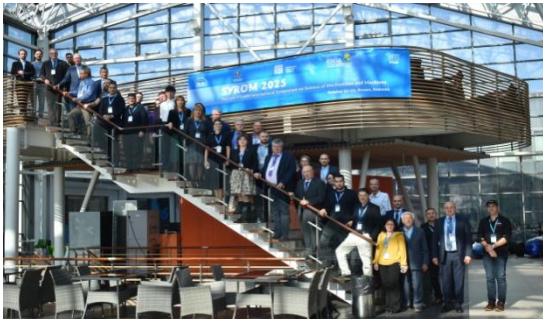

THE 14TH EDITION OF IFToMM INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON THE SCIENCE OF MECHANISMS AND MACHINES (SYROM) BRAȘOV, ROMANIA, 23-25 OCTOBER 2025



Continuing a long tradition, uninterrupted for over half a century, the 14th edition of IFToMM *International Symposium on the Science of Mechanisms and Machines* (SYROM 2025) took place in Brașov, from 23 to 25 October 2025, under the organization of *Renewable Energy Systems and Recycling Research Centre* (RESREC) within the Faculty of Product Design and Environment, in collaboration with Romanian Association for the Science of Mechanisms and Machines (ARoTMM) and Romanian Academy of Technical Sciences (ASTR). This international scientific event enjoyed the patronage of *International Federation for the Promotion of Mechanism and Machine Science* (IFToMM), with the scientific support of *Technical Committee for Linkages and Mechanical Controls*, *Technical Committee for Sustainable Energy Systems* and *Technical Committee for Computational Kinematics* within IFToMM, as well as the scientific support of *European Sustainable Energy Alliance* (ESEIA).

SYROM 2025 International Symposium brought together over 90 researchers from seven countries on three continents - scientists, experts and PhD candidates involved in the general field of mechanisms, mechanical transmissions and machines, who disseminated the latest results of their research and exchanged views on the future research directions in this field. We were honoured by the presence of four outstanding professional figures in the field of mechanisms and machines, who delivered exceptional plenary presentations: Prof. Andr s Kecskem thy (University Duisburg-Essen, Germany), current chairperson of IFToMM, with the presentation "IFToMM – Origins, Activities and Visions of Our Worldwide Community"; Prof. Marco Ceccarelli (University of Rome Tor Vergata,

Italy), former chairperson of IFToMM – "Robotics and Mechatronics, Mechanism Design, Innovation, History of MMS"; Prof. Burkhard Corves (RWTH Aachen University, Germany) – "Past, Current and Future Research Topics in Parallel Robotics with Special Emphasis on Delta Robotics Research at IGMR, RWTH Aachen University", and Prof. Giuseppe Quaglia (Politecnico di Torino, Italy) – "Service Robotics, Robotics for Healthcare, Robotics for Agriculture, Sustainable Development Goals".



All 33 presented papers will be published in a Springer Cham volume entitled *Advances in Mechanisms and Machine Science - Proceedings of the 14th IFToMM International Symposium on the Science of Mechanisms and Machines*, within the series *Mechanisms and Machine Science*, whose editors are Mircea Neagoe, Ioan Doroftei, Erwin Christian Lovasz, ISBN 978-3-032-14022-7. The book presents highly valuable original contributions on topics such as theoretical and computational kinematics, mechanism design, experimental mechanics, dynamics of machines and multi-body systems, mechanisms for biomechanics, mechanical transmissions, micromechanisms, serial and parallel robots, mobile and collaborative robots, medical robots.

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THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH (CERED 2025), IN THE 11TH EDITION



Between 2 and 4 October 2025, the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences hosted the National Conference on Educational Research – CERED 2025, the greatest national event in this field. Organised by the Romanian Association for Research in Education (ARCE) in partnership with our faculty, the conference – now in its 11th edition – brought together researchers, decision-makers and practitioners in a forum for scientific dialogue. The programme combined international perspectives with the national expertise, offering its participants opportunities of professional development in a high-quality scientific setting. Prof. Fabio Dovigo (University of L'Aquila, EERA expert), keynote speaker, presented the paper: *Where is European Research on Inclusive Education Heading? A Topic Modelling Analysis of ECER Abstracts Over the Past Twenty Years*.



CERED 2025 had on its agenda the international symposium *Service Learning as a Transformative Methodology in Higher Education*, with the participation of Assist. Prof. Esther García Zabaleta and Assist. Prof. David Recio Moreno (Public University of Navarre), as well as Prof. Simona Lidia Sava (West University of Timișoara). *Emerging Researchers Conference* (ERC) included training sessions led by Prof. Dragoș Iliescu (University of Bucharest), as well as by Assoc. Prof.

Camelia Truța and Lect. Elena Ungureanu (UNITBV). The panel *University and the Professors' Training* brought together, from the Romanian educational system, Prof. Daniel David – Minister of Education, Prof. Lucian Ciolan (UB), Prof. Romiță Iucu (UB), Prof. Ciprian Ceobanu (UAIC), Prof. Cătălin Glava (UBB), Prof. Ana-Maria Cazan and Assoc. Prof. Daniela Popa (UNITBV).

The five parallel workshops turned theory into practice: *Global Participatory Research* (Prof. Urszula Markowska-Manista, University of Warsaw), *Language Buddy in Action* (Assoc. Prof. Daniela Popa, Lect. Alina Turculeț, Lect. Marius Bazgan), *Visual Methods with Children and Youth* (Prof. Catalina Ulrich Hygum, Lect. Leyla Safta Zecheria, Octavia Bors Georgescu, Lect. Elena Ungureanu), *Positive emotions in Learning* (Prof. Daniel Mara, Lect. Alina Maria Moldovan), and *University Mentorship* (Prof. Mușata-Dacia Bocoș, Assoc. Prof. Mihaela-Gabriela Neacșu, Assoc. Prof. Mihaela Voinea). The eight thematic sections were dedicated to disseminating research results on educational policies, digital technologies, inclusion and creativity in education.



The event ended with the General Assembly of ARCE. Gratitude goes to the speakers who shared their expertise, to all participants for the dynamics of the sessions, to the volunteers for their professional conduct, and to the sponsors who fostered an environment conducive to scientific dialogue and networking. This conference has proved that rigorous educational research is the foundation for the development of the educational system.

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UNITBV CONFERENCES, AT A NEW EDITION: SCIENCE AND TOURISM – HOW SCIENCE ENHANCES TRAVEL

The sixth edition of the UNITBV Conferences, this high-profile event series, brought up an important topic, in the viewpoint of both researchers and citizens as tourists: *Science and Tourism – How Science Enhances Travel*. Prof Dr. Bianca Tescașiu, along with the moderator, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Dragoș Ioan Tohănean, tried to offer a unique perspective on the tourism industry, highlighting how science can influence the tourists' choices.



During the conference, the participants found out how research and science could contribute to the development of tourism and change the tourists' approach to travel. Concepts such as sustainability, responsible tourism, sustainable local development, permaculture, downshifting, co-creation, e-tourist were brought up for debate. Starting from the idea that the access to information offers the general public the opportunity to understand concepts, the speaker and the moderator tried to show the major significance that science can have for tourists, from two perspectives:

■ in terms of the opportunity of getting to better know the tourism market – through research results that can provide both information about the opinions of the tourists, tourism providers or authorities, as well as information about the new forms of tourism and their impact on the tourism industry;

■ in terms of the role of science for the development of tourism – by integrating scientific progress into the tourism product, which results in the emergence of new types of tourism products.



The conference also enjoyed the contribution of young graduate and doctoral students whose scientific concerns relate to tourism – Ioana Iulia Niță (1st-year doctoral student in the field of Marketing), Andrea Caridad Bringas Heredia (2nd-year CHORAL doctoral student) and Alexandru Homeghi (2nd-year graduate student in the Tourism Business Administration programme).

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2025 EUROPEAN DAY OF CIVIL JUSTICE – LAW IN THE SERVICE OF THE CITIZEN AND DEMOCRACY – LESSONS OF THE PAST, CHALLENGES OF THE PRESENT AND FUTURE TRENDS

The European Day of Civil Justice, established in 2003 by the Council of Europe and the European Commission, is celebrated every year around 25 October, and it is a good opportunity to highlight the role of justice as a service for the citizens.



In this context, Braşov Court, in partnership with the Faculty of Law within Transilvania University of Braşov and Braşov Bar Association organised, on 24 October 2025, in Astra Cinema hall, the conference symbolically named *Law in the service of the Citizen and Democracy – Lessons of the Past, Challenges of the Present and Future Directions*.

The event brought together magistrates, lawyers, academic teaching personnel and students in an interprofessional dialogue focused on the lessons learned from the past, on the good practices of the present, and on the integration of the changes that can ensure a modern justice system in a democratic society.

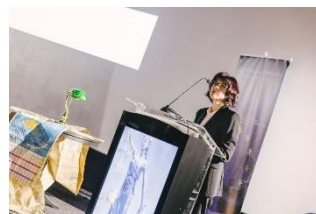
Thus, within the first panel *Path of Justice to Democracy – Lessons of the Past*, the former magistrates and lawyers, in addition to the presentations of great historical depth, recalled their experiences, illustrating how professional realities were influenced by the institutional and social context of the time.

The second panel, *Law in the Citizen's Service – Best Practices for Efficiency and Transparency*, emphasised on the one hand the national judge' role in the European judicial area, and on the other hand the legal instruments that enshrine, at international level, the lawyer's right to defend without fear and pressure, in a climate of independence and professional safety.

This panel also provided an opportunity for reflection on the increasingly important role of institutional communication, especially in the context of the values and standards promoted at European level.

The third panel, *Tomorrow's Justice: Ethics, Education and Transparency in the service of Democracy*, aimed at illustrating how the judicial system adapts to future challenges through transparency, technological innovation and civic engagement.

In this regard, digitalization has been shown as an essential direction for streamlining trials and, in general, judicial processes.



Legal education for citizens, deemed a pillar of any functional democratic society, plays an important role in strengthening democracy. The public's information on the rights, obligations and mechanisms of the judicial system fosters responsible civic participation, diminishes misunderstandings on the act of justice, and enhances a genuine judicial culture.

In conclusion, this festive moment was a moment of professional reflection on the evolution of justice, structured around three complementary directions, starting from the one which, by capitalising on the lessons of the past, helps reinforce the current guarantees of the judicial act and responsibly orient the system towards the challenges of the future.

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ACADEMIC PERSPECTIVES ON CONTEMPORARY PSYCHOLOGY – COLLABORATION BETWEEN FPSE AND TREI/PUBLISHING HOUSE

Starting on 7 October, the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences organised three other events within the “PSI Week”, in partnership with TREI Publishing House and Cărturești Bookstore in the Council Square. During the evenings of Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, the faculty’s teaching personnel, alongside psychology specialists gave presentations and held dialogues on various topics of great relevance:



■ *From Early Needs to Family Dynamics: Child Rearing in Today’s Context*

Ioana Georgiana Mărcineanu offered valuable benchmarks to parents and professionals, with an emphasis on the fulfilment of the children’s and teenagers’ needs – from safety and emotional support, to the balanced enhancement of their potential. Moreover, she highlighted the essential role of a safe, supportive and harmonious environment for their development.

■ *Attachment - How It Forms and What Its Role Is Throughout Life*

Laura Teodora David, using a clear and accessible language, but building her presentation on scientifically validated theories and recent research, presented the main concepts of the attachment theory, as well as intervention methods applicable in a broad framework. She foregrounded withal the need to value the healthy relational models and to change the dysfunctional ones, highlighting the view on attachment not only as a structure determined by the early relationships with

one’s parents, but also as a dynamic resource, essential for ongoing personal development.

■ *How to Break the Cycle of Drama – From Repetitive Conflicts to Real Connections*

Daniela Popa brought up the overcoming of repetitive relationship patterns likely to sabotage interpersonal bonds, highlighting the ways to build real and lasting relationships. She analysed the psychological mechanisms underlying the “drama on repeat” concept, and proposed effective strategies for turning conflicts into opportunities of rapprochement and emotional response adjustment, with a view to cultivating relationships conducive to personal development and inner balance, instead of entailing exhaustion.



As in previous editions, the events unfolded in a relaxed and intellectually boosting atmosphere, in which readers of all ages, students, practicing psychologists and teachers gathered around ideas and authentic dialogue. The participants showed deep interest in the proposed topics, reflected in the questions addressed to the specialists, the nuanced interventions and the active involvement in the evening debates. The lively and reflective participation turned these events not only into opportunities to disseminate psychological knowledge, but also into genuine meeting spaces between experience, reflection and scientific curiosity.

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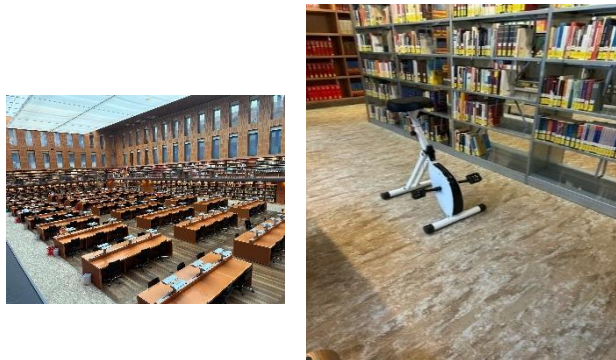

ERASMUS-EDU-2024-CBHE-STRAND-2 101179133.



The event brought together professors, researchers and international partners in a setting dedicated to the exploration of the latest trends in digital education and entrepreneurial training.



The participants discussed innovative teaching methods, the development of open educational resources and the integration of digital skills into the curriculum.

A special moment was the visit to the Library of the University of Dresden, a facility redefined as a centre for academic innovation, which includes, in particular:

- Scanning booths for mobile document digitization;
- Library of things – cameras, tools and equipment available for loan;
- Reading and exercise areas – combining study with physical well-being.



The NSIS meeting has strengthened international collaboration and has offered a fresh perspective on how university facilities can support both intellectual and personal development. The project still builds bridges between continents, promoting inclusive and innovative education.

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BLOCKCHAIN TECHNOLOGY IN SUPPORT OF THE CIRCULAR ECONOMY

Transilvania University of Braşov is a partner in the international project [RockChain](#) – *Transversal Technological Skills for the Ornamental Rock Industry Focusing on the Applicability of Blockchain in a Circular Economy* (2023-1-DE02-KA220-ADU-000166863), co-financed by the European Union through the Erasmus+ programme, now in the final stage of development and implementation. In the 21st century, digital technologies underlie economic and social development, and their adoption in traditional sectors, such as building stone industry, is becoming essential for the transition to a sustainable economy.



RockChain project addresses this challenge by creating an innovative educational and professional platform that integrates technologies such as *Blockchain*, *Internet of Things (IoT)* and *Big Data* for waste management and traceability of materials in the building stone industry. The initiative targets the professionals, but also the students, offering them digital tools and interactive educational materials that foster the required skills necessary in digitizing and greening industrial processes. The project mainly aims at developing a transparent and decentralized document tracking system covering the entire waste management process, at raising awareness on the importance of circular economy, and at encouraging entrepreneurship in the field of waste management and Blockchain technology. The project brings together four European partners with complementary experience: Deutscher Naturwerkstein-Verband e.V. (DNV) – Germany (project leader), Centro Tecnológico del Mármol, Piedra y Materiales (CTM) – Spain, Transilvania University of Braşov – Romania and Klesarska škola – Croatia.

The inaugural meeting, held at Parque Científico de Murcia, in November 2023, established the strategic directions for the implementation of a circular economy system for the natural stone industry. During the discussions, the partners exchanged ideas on the integration of the Blockchain technology into the

manufacturing and recycling processes, and defined the structure of the activities, the measurable objectives and the dissemination plan. After one year of implementation, the project team met at Klesarska škola of Pučišća (Croatia), to develop a common European curriculum dedicated to waste management, as well as interdisciplinary training materials, and an interactive Blockchain-based e-Learning instrument for the circular economy.

The final meeting, organised in Aschaffenburg, October 2025, marked the formal closure of the project. The partners presented the final results, assessed the pilot course and international seminar, discussed the future directions of cooperation, and analysed the educational, scientific and technological impact of the conducted activities.



The UNITBV team played an active role in developing the educational resources and disseminating the results, publishing four scientific articles in international journals, and participating in two international conferences. These activities strengthened the international visibility of the project, promoted interdisciplinary collaboration, and contributed to the achievement of the Erasmus+ programme goals.

Through this initiative, UNITBV helps develop innovative European solutions to the challenges of digitalization, waste management and green transition, while strengthening the international partnerships in the fields of research, vocational training and educational innovation.

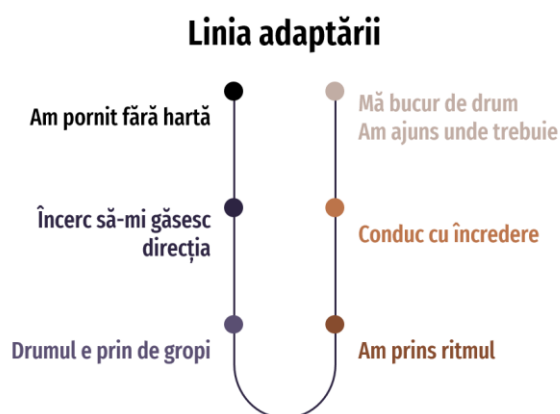

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CHALLENGES OF THE JUNIOR YEAR

The first study year is not only the beginning of a new academic stage, but also a period of self-discovery. Between excitement and insecurity, between curiosity and homesickness, every student finds his/her own pace. In order to support the students in the process of adaptation to this new context, [The Career Counselling and Guidance Centre \(CCOC\)](#) organised, on 22 October, the workshop "Challenges of the Junior Year – A Practical Guide to Adaptation", a meeting dedicated to exploring the specific changes, emotions and resources of the transition to academic life.

During the meeting, one of the central reflections was the idea that adaptation unfolds in natural steps – from uncertainty to clarity, from effort to balance – a path that everyone travels at their own pace.



The workshop became a space for authentic dialogue, where the students talked about the emotions of the beginning, about expectations, fears and first successes. The meeting encouraged honesty and sharing, and proved that vulnerability could be a starting point for growth. The activity assumed that adaptation was a natural process, involving adjustments at the academic, emotional and social levels – a balance that is built over time, through learning, awareness and mutual support.

Through self-awareness exercises and group dialogue, the participants reflected on how the student's role changed as against the former pupil's one: from a structured framework, with clear rules and constant supervision, to a context based on autonomy, responsibility and self-organization. The discussions dwelled on the importance of time

planning, stress management and supportive relationships between peers and professors alike.



The emphasis was withal placed on understanding and accepting one's own emotions – from homesickness and a feeling of being overwhelmed, to curiosity and the zest for discovering a new rhythm of life. The participants identified useful strategies for maintaining their balance: to form healthy routines, to take care of themselves, to cultivate self-compassion and to capitalise on the resources offered by the university, including CCOC's counselling services.

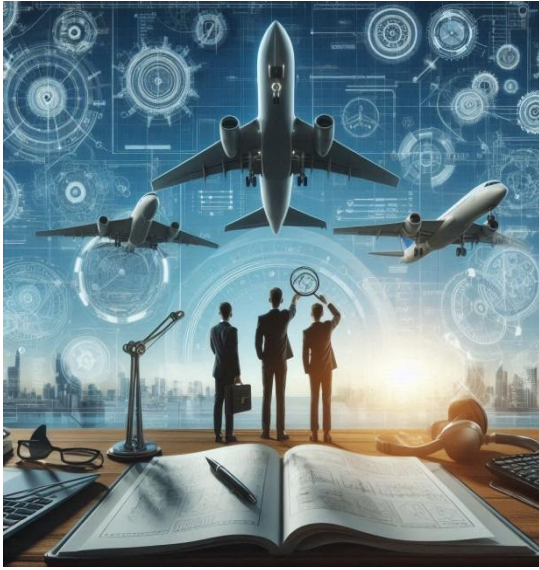
The meeting ended in a warm atmosphere, with messages of encouragement and the shared belief that all students eventually find their adaptation pace, and that the university provides the right setting for turning the challenges of the beginning into an experience of growth and maturation.

Every beginning brings along anxiety, but also a new force of adaptation. With the proper support and confidence in his/her own resources, any student can turn the first year into a story of boldness and discovery.

The master's study programme Aviation Engineering and Management (taught in English) is a recent initiative of the Department of Engineering and Industrial Management, within the Faculty of Technological Engineering and Industrial Management, which has stirred a high interest since its very launch, confirming the need for specialization in this dynamic field. With a curriculum adapted to the demands of the aeronautical industry and an interdisciplinary approach, this master's programme had a large number of candidates in the July 2025 admission session, and enjoyed the appreciation of both students and economic partners.



The practical experience strengthened the connection between the academic environment and industry, contributing to the formation of an applied perspective on the field of aviation. The visit was appreciated by both students and professors, and is another example of good collaboration between the university and the local institutions.

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NEW TALENTS IN THE TEAM OF RADIO CAMPUS TRANSILVANIA



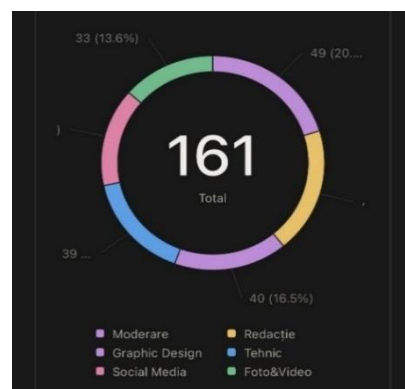

"TOGETHER FOR WOMEN'S SAFETY" MARCH

The third edition of "Together for Women's Safety" march, organised at national level for over 10 years by the Network for Prevention and Combating of Violence against Women (VIF), took place in Braşov, on 18 October 2025.



The march through Braşov was organised by *Alternative Step* Association, a VIF network member, with the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences, the Network of Professionals in Preventing and Combating Domestic Violence, and "I Will Also Succeed" Winner Network as its partners and co-organizers.

Its manifesto included three essential elements:

- Overt solidarity with the women and girls who are victims of violence.
- Support for the amendment of the legislation on the prevention of femicide and its preceding violence, so that in all cases of violence against women, the risk should be timely assessed and identified, and the authorities could order protective measures beforehand.
- Promotion of the education on gender equality in order for it to be introduced into the pre-university curricula.



The march was attended by 1,200 persons - youth, students, teachers, women still facing or having

escaped violence, professionals in specialised intervention and assistance services, but also by a great number of local people who dream of a world where girls and women live safely, and where gender equality and respect for the women's rights are core values.



The students of the Faculty of Psychology and Education Sciences were actively involved both in the preceding organizational activities and in the actual march, voicing its message of solidarity "None defeated! None forgotten! None less!" The students have thus learned what it means to support social causes and get involved in the community, where education, awareness and responsibility are needed.

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CHAMBER JAZZ @ TRANSILVANIA UNIVERSITY: CANTICA PROFANA

The tenth season of Chamber Jazz @ Transilvania University was opened with a special concert, performed by Lucian Ban, Mat Maneri, Marco Colonna and Gerald Cleaver. The audience could revel in the peasants' voices recorded by Béla Bartók more than a hundred years ago in Transylvania's villages, reimagined through jazz by a quartet of famous musicians, in Studio 181 room, Rectorate building, on 21 October.



The Romanian-American pianist Lucian Ban, born in Cluj, Romania, the American violist Mat Maneri, the Italian clarinetist Marco Colonna, and one of the leading contemporary jazz drummers, the American Gerald Cleaver came together and, during a five-day residence in Transylvania's heart, rediscovered through jazz and improvisation the essence of the songs collected by the famous composer.

The tandem of the Romanian-American pianist Lucian Ban and of the American violist Mat Maneri is known and appreciated all over the world for the deep melange between folklore and improvisation, for the recontextualizations between classical music and jazz, but also for the strive to outline an ideal of chamber jazz. Financial Times describes "the complex interweaving between the unique sound of Mat Maneri's viola and Lucian Ban's amply resonant piano as a delight of contemporary jazz for more than a decade".

Gerald Cleaver, born in Detroit, is appreciated for his versatile style that naturally blends the jazz tradition with avant-garde improvisation. He has worked with a wide range of musicians such as Henry Threadgill,

Roscoe Mitchell, Matthew Shipp, William Parker and Charles Gayle.



Marco Colonna, born in Rome, 1978, is a world-renowned musician, multi-instrumentalist, composer and improviser, particularly famous for his mastery of the bass clarinet. His musical style is at the intersection of jazz, free improvisation, avant-rock and contemporary musical language, being often described by the critics as "fascinating" and "ingenious".



All along his career, for about two decades, Colonna has collaborated with many prestigious musicians, such as Alexander Hawkins, Agustí Fernandez, Andrew Cyrille, Roberto Ottaviano and Evan Parker, sealing his reputation as an eclectic and creative artist.
